

REQUIRED PROOF OF FUNDING

The University of Denver is required to verify that international students have sufficient funds to cover their educational and living expenses before issuing the immigration document needed to apply for F-1 status (Form I-20) or J-1 status (Form DS-2019).

These funds can be proven in the form of bank documents, awards from the University of Denver, sponsorships from outside the University, or any combination of these funding sources.

- F-1 applicants must show sufficient funding for one academic year (3 quarters/2 semesters).
- J-1 applicants must show sufficient funding for the entire length of their program.

Students who plan to bring their spouse and/or dependent children under the age of 21 as F-2 or J-2 dependents will need to provide additional funding.

Spouse: \$5,200 per academic year

Each Child: \$3,960 per academic year

- Tuition estimates use the average number of credits needed each term to complete a program within the timeframe listed on the immigration document.

Bachelor's = Four Years

Graduate Certificate = Two or three quarters depending on program requirements

Master's = Two Years

LLM = Three Semesters

PhD = Seven Years (Three years of coursework plus dissertation)

JD = Three Years
